

RNFOO 2019 Awards Available to RPNs

The process for distributing RNFOO Awards and Scholarships is based on the academic year. The on-line application process for these awards opens in December, and closes in mid-January. There are 60 awards available, with a total value more than \$80,000.

The awards described below specifically mention RPNs in their criteria. There are other awards that are also available to RPNs enrolled in BScN programs. If you are studying, or considering a special project, you should consider applying for support through RNFOO.

Winners of the RNFOO Awards and Scholarships will be celebrated at the RNFOO Gala on Wednesday, May 1, 2019.

Mary Brunning Harkin Scholarship (2 x \$1,500)

To support a Registered Nurse or Registered Practical Nurse studying at the baccalaureate level, or a nursing student in their 3rd or 4th year. Applicants must show that their career path is dedicated to care of the elderly.

Josephine Flaherty Scholarship (1 x \$1,000)

To support to a Post-Diploma Registered Nurse or a Registered Practical Nurse, enrolled in baccalaureate education. Preference will be given to those applicants who demonstrate active volunteerism.

Regina Borowska Scholarship (10 x \$1,000)

To support individuals who are enrolled in nursing education at the baccalaureate level. Preference will be given to Post-Diploma RNs, and RPNs who demonstrate potential to contribute to the advancement of nursing.

RPNAO: Post RPN Program Award (1 x \$500)

To support a Registered Practical Nurse pursuing ongoing education (Continuing Education or RPN to RN Bridging Program) that will enhance patient care and patient outcomes. Applicants need not be enrolled in a degree program. Applicants must demonstrate a patient-centred approach to care.

Saint Elizabeth Scholarship (1 x \$2,500)

To support a nurse (RN or RPN) who is enrolled in education at the Baccalaureate or graduate level. Applicants must show that their career path is dedicated to Community Nursing.
